school. We are currently participating in the Easter Recycling Competition and this is being judged next week. If you have any Easter Egg cartons left at home, please send them in!




Healthy Eating in School

One of the targets that Un Llais is working towards this year is building on our approach to healthy eating and drinking in school.

We are very proud of the work that Un Llais has already undertaken to achieve the second leaf of the Healthy Schools Scheme. However, during their research, it has become apparent that since we have returned from Covid lockdown, there are a minority of pupils who are bringing in drinks which are not permitted under the Healthy Eating in Schools statutory guidance along with our school's Healthy Eating policy. This guidance states that schools should permit only water during lesson times because it promotes hydration, has no calories, quenches thirst and does not damage teeth. Drinking water is beneficial for our health and diet, and is full of nutrients that help hydrate us, helping our brain and body get ready for learning.
