Workplace Recycling

'Please Take your Rubbish Home Initiative'



Whilst we are very good at recycling, what we do recycle will now have to be separated as per the new Workplace Recycling scheme in Wales. [Workplace recycling | GOV.WALES](https://www.gov.uk/workplace-recycling)

Whilst we can recycle most of our school rubbish, the biggest cost comes in the collection of the general non-recyclable waste. In school, most of this comes from pupils' snack and lunch time packaging which often cannot be recycled as it is 'contaminated' with food waste and paper towels for hand drying which are also classed as general waste.

From this term we are introducing our '**please take you rubbish home**' initiative. You have probably already noticed that we are asking pupils to take their snack and lunchtime packaging waste back home with them to be washed and recycled at home. This will save the school money by reducing mixed waste, general waste for non recycling materials and food waste. Contaminated recyclable materials is a real challenge for us, so by taking snack waste and food waste from sandwiches lunchtime; this really reduces the costs associated with our general non recyclable waste collection.
